





RSS News Example

Slide notes: Before showing an example of a Court RSS feed, let's look at how a user might setup an RSS feed to view news headlines - this example illustrates some of the features of RSS.

There are many RSS feed readers available for Internet Explorer 7 or Firefox 3; however, this slide will be an example using FeedDemon as the RSS reader.

The sidebar on the left lists the feeds to which the user subscribes. By selecting NPR Topics - News, the user can scroll through a list of recent news stories. Unread items are indicated in bold.

By clicking on an item name, details appear in the bottom window or panel which allows for more information about the article.

Clicking the item in the bottom area will direct your default web browser to the URL and open the article of the item, and the full story appears in the window.

Depending on your configuration, when the content provider releases a new item, a pop up may appear in the corner of the screen, disappearing after a few seconds.

Handy features of this RSS reader include many configuration settings, located in the tool bar area...well worth exploring.

Again, this is just one example of an RSS reader setup and interface. This reader will also allow users to filter item content.

For example, a user could subscribe to a feed about court information, and could filter items so the feed posts an alert only if the string 'ECF', was encountered in the short title of a feed.



Slide notes: We now see two items of interest. First, notice after having clicked the orange RSS icon, the URL has changed to the .xml format URL, which is common for RSS feeds.

And second, firefox is offering to help me subscribe to the feed. Since FeedDemon is already installed on this computer I will choose to subscribe this Court RSS feed to FeedDemon.





Slide notes: The subscription process opens FeedDemon and it offers us several choices. The title can be modified. A new folder can be made or a current folder can be selected. We will put this feed in the CourtBK folder. Then click the Next button.

Slide notes: Again, the sidebar on the left lists the feeds and notice the new one we just subscribed to is listed and is in bold because we have yet to view any of the content. We can scroll through a list of "whats new" headlines in this window.

Unread items are indicated in bold. By clicking on an item name, details appear in the bottom window which allows for more information about the article.

So, if you are finding yourself visiting several different Court web sites to stay current on Court information, perhaps you will find the utilization of RSS an efficient method to stay current.

By the way, the technique of subscribing to an RSS feed will differ somewhat, but overall it is a similar process in other RSS readers.

Using an RSS reader is an easy and efficient way to gather a wide variety of content in one place on your computer. Rather than having to revisit a web site to find out if there is new content, the RSS reader shows it all to you in one screen. Many RSS readers also 'alert' you when new content from your favorite web site is delivered. RSS also has the potential for replacing some email lists.
