ORDER CONCERNING THE TAKING LERK US DIST COURT

OF PHOTOGRAPHS IN THE COURTROOM

OR ITS ENVIRONS

On March 8-9, 1962, the Judicial Conference of the United States adopted the following resolution:

Resolve, That the Judicial Conference of the United States condemns the taking of photographs in the courtroom or its environs in connection any judicial proceedings, and the broadcasting of judicial proceedings by radio, television, or other means, and considers such practices to be inconsistent with fair judicial procedure and that they ought not to be permitted in any federal court.

Pursuant to said resolution, and as an amplification of the policy embodied in it, as applied to the United States Courthouse in Madison, Wisconsin, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

That no photographs of any kind are to be taken on the second, third, fourth or fifth floors of said building during any judicial proceedings, or immediately prior to or following any judicial proceedings.
